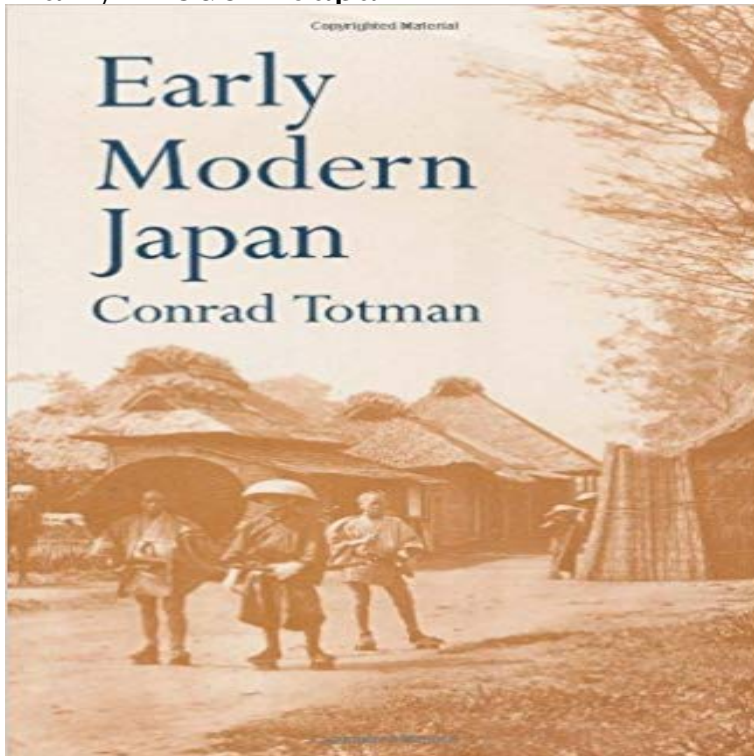


## Early Modern Japan
