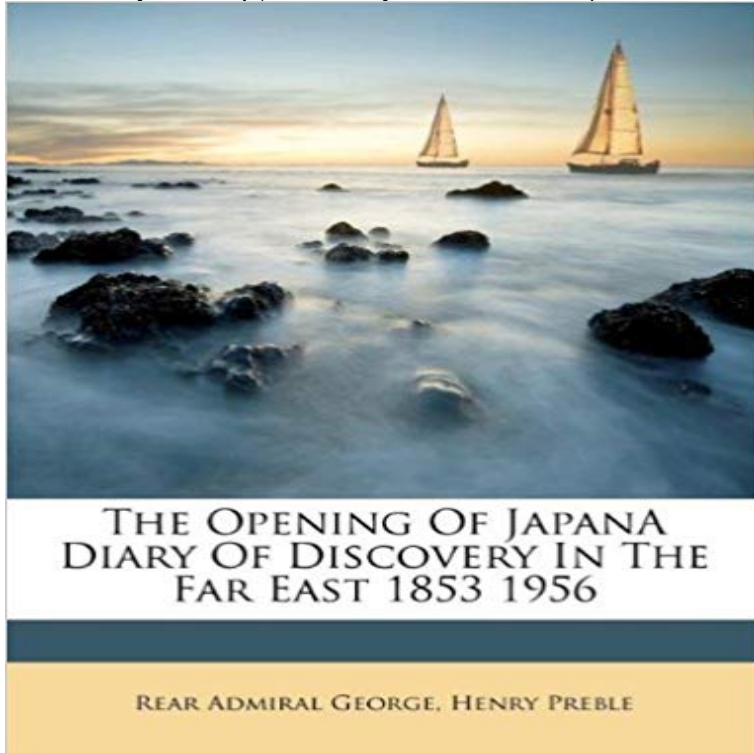


# The Opening Of Japan A Diary Of Discovery In The Far East 1853 1956
