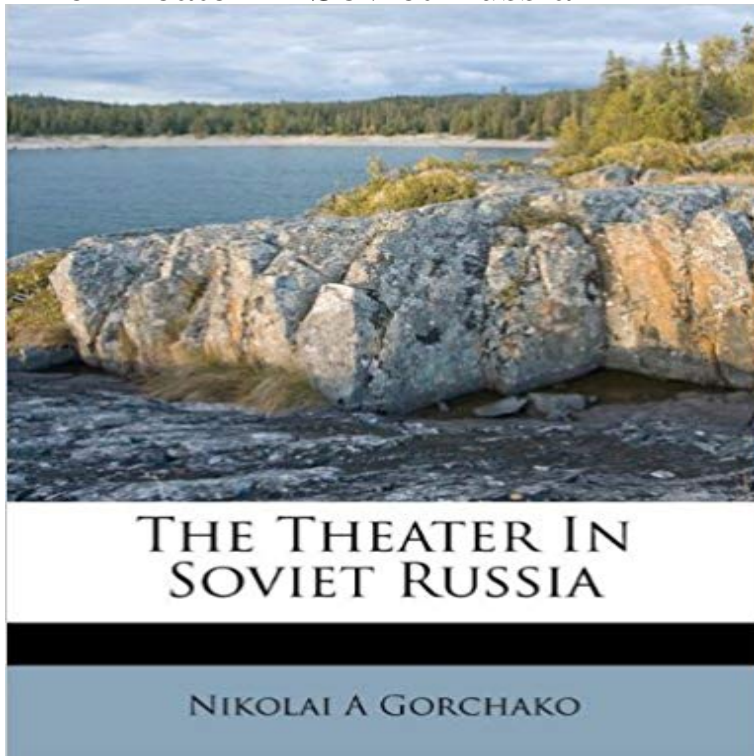


## The Theater In Soviet Russia
