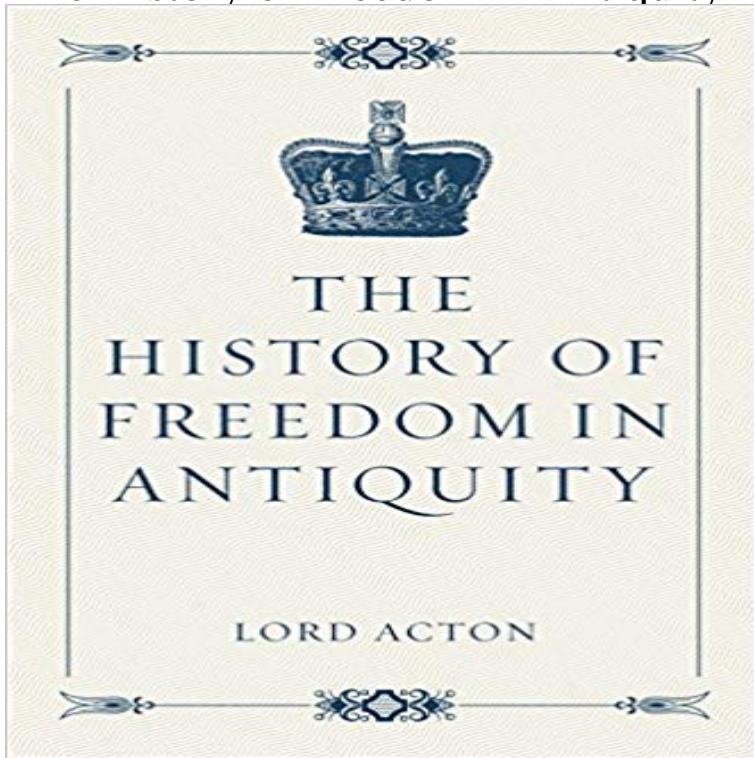


The History of Freedom in Antiquity
