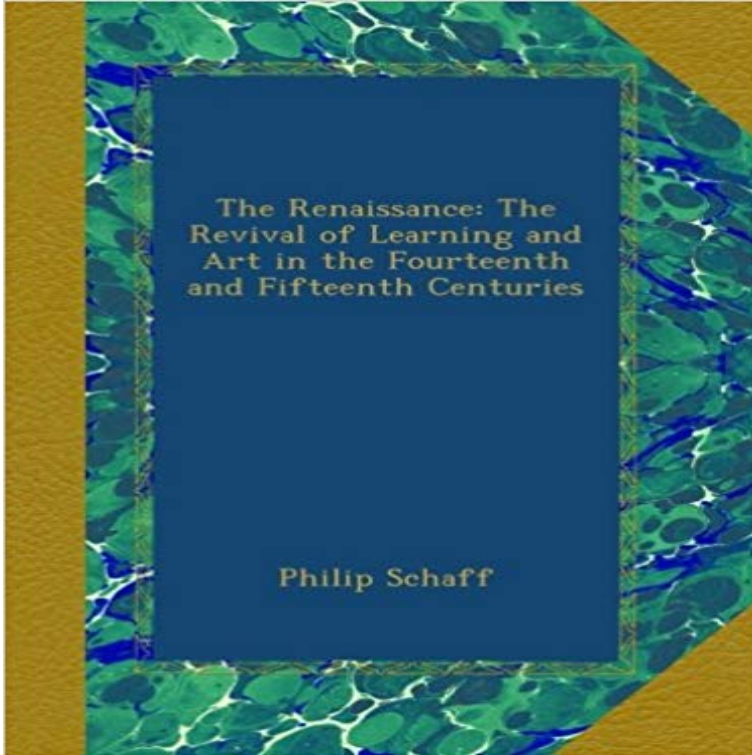


# The Renaissance: The Revival of Learning and Art in the Fourteenth and Fifteenth Centuries
